I elaborated that life is a gift from God and an opportunity to develop a relationship with Him, serve others, and grow in love. As for Jesus, I described Him as the Savior, Deliverer, Redeemer, and King of kings who physically rose from the grave. Lastly, I shared with them the famous verse from John 3:16, which says that God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son for its salvation.



Moved by the Holy Spirit, I held one of their hands and prayed over them. I believe that they were touched by the Holy Spirit during our encounter and that God is continuing to work in their lives.

More importantly, one of the students has come forward to make a public declaration of his faith by expressing the desire to be baptized. The ministry is working closely with the student to prepare him for the sacrament of baptism and arrange the baptism ceremony, which will be a joyous occasion for the student and their family. The ministry intends to continue its outreach efforts and support students in exploring and deepening their faith.



The ministry is thrilled to have made these connections and is committed to continuing to support these students and others as they explore their faith. They believe that through community and prayer, anyone can grow in their relationship with God and experience the transformative power of His love.
